


Research Participants Wanted toStudy <u>Concussion and Hearing</u> in Teens*(ages13-18)

The aim of this study is to understand how concussion affects hearing, thinking, and balance in the months following an injury.

*Teens with recent concussion (and current concussion symptoms) and teens without concussion are needed.

What does the study involve?

- Answering questions about your hearing, health, and concussion history
- Having your hearing tested and participating in listening tests and thinking skills tests (like repeating words in noise and remembering lists)
- Measuring objective ear & brain responses while you sit comfortably
- Measuring your balance while you stand with eyes open and closed.
- Provide a saliva sample by cheek swab or spitting into a cup.
- You will participate in two visits, 3 to 6 months apart. Testing takes about 2 1/2 hours each visit and eligible participants will be compensated up to \$75 per visit in cash (\$150 total).





WHO CAN PARTICIPATE:

13 - 18 year olds who:


- Either have had one recent concussion (verified and still having symptoms) and no previous significant concussions <u>OR</u> have had no diagnosed concussions
- ✤ Have normal hearing when tested
- Have no history of major neurological, psychological disorder, or learning disorder.
- Are native English speakers
